The Ducklings Learn About Transportation!




In May the Duckling classes learn about transportation—Land, Air & Water. They will make boats, hot air balloons and airplanes. ART: May is Weaving & Sewing Month...

Throughout the year the children have been developing their fine motor skills while gluing, beading, lacing and using a wide variety of manipulatives. During May they will be working on weaving and sewing projects while learning about basic construction. Weaving is probably the oldest elemental skill used, known to man. It is commonly used in all cultures worldwide. The children will learn

that their blankets, rugs and clothing are woven. Spiders weave their webs and birds build their nest using weaving techniques. Through this project they will learn to see and understand patterns, position, and design. In the meantime, they understand process, and are allowed to experiment and can create. Please look for our Fiber Art display in the hallways early in the month.

The children are anxiously awaiting the arrival of our butterflies. Each classroom has a butterfly house with caterpillars that are busy spinning up into their cocoon.
