



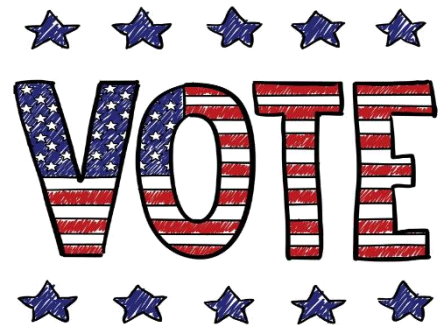
The Giving Nest Preschool November Newsletter
