Cognitive Development Activities for the Month:

- We will identify animals and their colors; i.e. pink pig, black cat, etc.
- On Dr. Suess' Birthday we will have various story times throughout the day, including One fish, Two fish, Red fish, Blue Fish!
- We will be practicing the concepts of "hiding and finding" while playing hide and go seek with various stuffed animals.
- Can we find the Leprechaun?
- Are we happy or sad? We will make an art project showing our emotion while singing a Happy Song!

Physical Development (Large & Small Muscle) Activities for the Month:

Large Muscle Skills:

- We will be practicing catching and throwing with various objects including bean bags, balls and balloons.
- As we listen and learn animal sounds, we will begin mimicking the walking patterns of various animals, i.e. crawling like a turtle, walking like a duck, hopping like a bunny, etc.

Small Muscle Skills:

- The children will have challenging fun sorting and filling containers with various objects such as popsicle sticks, rocks, pompoms, bean bags and pipe cleaners. The fun will continue when we dump the objects out of the containers!
- We will continue working with different forms of clay and play dough to increase dexterity and strength in the extremities. Sometimes we will find hidden surprises in the clay!

Creative Art Development Activities for the Month:

- We will continue to work with holding a paint brush and making even strokes across the page.
- We will do some messy art this month because we LOVE messy art! Smocks will definitely be required!
