Mark your Calendar - January 8th, 2020 from 7:00 to 8:30 "Is My Child Ready For Today's Kindergarten?"

If this is your first child going off to kindergarten and/or if you have a child who has a summer or fall birthday then this is a great workshop to attend! The workshop will be given by Jill Presley (Assistant Director), Laurie Rivera (Kindergarten Teacher) and Kiley Squier (Parent and 4th Grade Teacher).

They will talk about the 'Kindergarten of Today'. A questionnaire was sent to the public schools that our students from our 5 locations will attend when they graduate from The Giving Nest. Their findings will be discussed at the workshop.



Giving Forest:

Challenge: How fast can your sled go down the hill?

Book: Ten on the Sled by Kim Norman

Teaching Strategy:

- 1. Build a sled out of the egg carton for your toy figurine.
- 2. Use the cardboard and tape to build a ramp.
- 3. Test your sled. Does it slide down the hill? Redesign as necessary.
- 4. Time your sled to see how fast it slides down the ramp.
- 5. Try adding foil to the ramp or adding pennies (or weight) to your sled.

Guiding Questions:

- 1. How can you make your sled go faster down the hill?
- 2. What type of materials do you think would make a fast sled?
- 3. Have you been sledding down a hill?
