#### **GIVING NEST NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS**

We wish everyone a happy and healthy new year. The arrival for 2020 will be celebrated at the Giving Nest with noisemakers and confetti. Each class will be challenged with a new skill to accomplish in 2020.

**The Chickadees** (2 1/2 to 3 year olds) will now place their backpacks on the hooks by their symbols, then remove the folders and place them in the folder box and remove the lunch boxes and place them in the lunch box bin. A big independent three step task for our little ones.

**The Ducklings** (3 to 4 year olds) will begin getting their own coats at the end of the day and putting them on without any help. They will use the preschool method of laying the coats on the ground and putting their arms in the sleeves and flipping the coats over their heads.

The Bluebirds and Cardinals (4 to 5 year olds) will begin zippering, buttoning and/or snapping their own coats and putting on their hats and gloves all by themselves.

The teachers have certificates to present to the children when they have successfully mastered the skill. Look for this in your child's backpack. Please note these are important skills to develop at your child's age. If he or she is having trouble, please practice his/her classes' selected skill at home. Several of the children in each age group may have already mastered these skills, which is great. They will receive a certificate once they demonstrate the skill for the teacher. Our New Year's resolution, as a school, will be to encourage each child to learn his/her address. We will also have certificates for those students that master this important skill

## SOUNDS ABOUND PROGRAM...

In January the Bluebird and Cardinal classes will incorporate the Sounds Abound program into their school routine. "Sounds Abound" teaches phonological awareness. Phonological awareness is a language skill that involves understanding the different ways in which spoken language can be broken down and manipulated into smaller units: words, syllables, and phonemes. It is the single, most important factor in learning to read and spell. Phonological awareness involves the following sub-skills: Rhyming, isolating words in a sentence, segmenting words into syllables and sounds, blending syllables and sounds together and manipulating sounds within words. The kindergarten children are introduced to all areas of the program and, as stated, the Bluebird and Cardinal classes focus on the "rhyming" portion. Studies have shown that rhyming is a crucial early phonological awareness skill and children who have difficulty rhyming will have difficulty reading. Sounds Abound presents three key levels of rhyming and they are:

- 1. Rhyme Recognition: The ability to recognize that two words rhyme. The class will play a game called "I Know a Name that Rhymes With..."
- 2. Rhyme Completion: The ability to complete or predict the rhyme from a particular sentence structure. The class will play a game called "A-Hunting We Will Go".
- 3. Rhyme Production: The ability to make up a rhyme without any clues. The children will play a game called "Chicken Soup With Noodles".
